1 Science East Science Centre

Location: 668 Brunswick Street.

Christ Church Cathedral

2 Location: Corner of Brunswick and Church Street near the cenotaph. The Cathedral is a National Historic Site, constructed / completed by 1853, and is one of the finest examples of decorated gothic architecture in North America. The Cathedral was modeled after the medieval parish church of St. Mary's at Snettisham, England. The Cathedral contains the letters patent from Queen Victoria constituting Fredericton as a Cathedral City.

Admission: Free all year long. Free guided tours in both official languages with student tour guides from July 1 until August 31.

Hours: Monday – Friday, 9am. – 4pm. Closed all day Saturday and Sunday afternoon following the last morning service.

All tours (private or school-related) must be arranged through Fran Miles, Administrative Assistant. Tours can be as short or as long as required.

3 The Beaverbrook Art Gallery

Location: 703 Queen Street.

The Earth Sciences Museum offers tours of fossilized bones and dinosaur replica of a reptile believed to have roamed the province hundreds of centuries ago. A large-scale display shows a journey to the centre of the earth, a chunk of a meteor that fell to earth near Fredericton, a working seismograph, and a mineral showcase with info on Fredericton and NB geology.

13 Government House

Location: 51 Woodstock Road.

Often called "New Brunswick's Ceremonial Home", this National and Provincial Historic Site is the residence and office of the province's Lieutenant-Governor. Awards ceremonies, medal presentations, honours, public receptions, lectures, concerts and more take place in the restored rooms of what is Canada's most-publically accessible Vice Regal residence. Rooms are filled with period antiques made by some of the best craftsmen in all of North America, along with significant donated items, contemporary New Brunswick art and links to the province's three founding cultures – First Nations, French and English.

Tours in both Official Languages can be geared towards various curriculum: New Brunswick history, political science, architecture, culture, the role of the Lieutenant-Governor and more.

B Mactaquac Biodiversity Facility

One of the largest Atlantic Salmon conservation hatcheries in the world. Learn how migratory fish resources, particularly Atlantic Salmon, are protected at Mactaquac and about the conservation efforts for this endangered species. Tour the unique salmon rearing facility where about 400,000 juvenile and 5000 adult salmon are raised.

C Mactaquac Generating Station

The largest hydroelectric Generating Station in the Maritime provinces went into operation in 1968 and now produces in excess of 670,000 kilowatts. The dam, which raised the water level almost 40 metres, is a rock-filled structure with a watertight clay core. Students will learn about the powerhouse with the turbines and generators, and how electrical current is transmitted.

Discover outdoor wonder and experience! Mactaquac Provincial Park offers a series of "Learning in Nature Adventures" from April through until November. These are half or full day journeys are facilitated by a Parks Officer for groups or classes of youth ranging from Kindergarten through to University level. This experiential learning is introduced and explored in a safe, fun and supportive atmosphere with themes like:

1. The Park environment, ecology and natural history,
2. nature interpretation and
3. environmental ethics.
